

Message from the Coordinating Team

Dear Sophia Members,

Welcome to 2024 at Sophia. The Opening Celebration was a peaceful, gentle way to begin our new year. We again wrote of hopes for this coming year. We acknowledged Yalmay Yunupingu as Senior Citizen of 2024, and watched a short video about her ongoing efforts to share native language, particularly in childrens' published literature. Jenny spoke about the new focus for Aboriginal Reconciliation in 2024 by way of a Scholarship fund, which replaces the previous grants that were distributed via Flinders Universty to Indigenous students from monies donated by Sophia members. Maureen spoke of the organisation 'Spirit of Woman' and the ongoing endeavour to have 'The Place of Courage' Ripples Across SA installations created across the state. These locations and installations are where people can go and reflect on women and children victims and survivors of domestic and family violence; places of peace and safety. The first such place in the Dominican Peace Gardens unfortunately met with the theft of the beautiful statue situated there. However, a new location will be established in the gardens soon, now with improved security.

Late last year we were very fortunate to receive a bequest from Nadeya Maystrenko's estate. We have used this to install CCTV around Sophia as there have been some thefts from the grounds. I like to think that in this way Nadeya is forever looking over our/her beloved gardens with protective eyes. Thank you Nadeya!

Catherine Pari has been a long term volunteer in our gardens. She recently resigned from this work. We wish to thank her for all the years of dedication, care, love and creativity, and hard work that she has contributed to Sophia, and the wider Dominican Peace gardens. Catherine will remain connected to Sophia and her friends here, and also pursue other interests and leisures. We wish her well! Robyn Garrett has been volunteering along with Catherine for some time now and will continue Catherine's work, as well as bringing her own touches. Thank you Robyn. She is well supported by Jenny and Dinali, and Kenny who also does gardening for the Dominicans. What a team!







New Children's Books

Three wonderful children's (for adults too) books have recently been donated to the Sophia Library and are currently on display.

'In My Blood It Runs' (2023) by Dujuan Hoosan, Margaret Anderson and Carol Turner is based on an award winning film and has vivid illustrations by Blak Douglas (winner of the Archibald Prize in 2022). It is narrated by Dujuan Hoosan, a 10-year-old Arrernte/Garawa boy who is wise and cheeky. He is also a healer. Out in the bush his healing power is wise but in town, it gets him into trouble. His family send him to live out bush to learn the ways and history of the old people.

'Tamarra – A story of termites on Gurindji Country' (2023) is a fascinating and informative book that celebrates termites through the stories of the Gurundji people. With full page artworks and photos, this is the outcome of a collaboration between over thirty First Nations and non-Indigenous artists, strorytellers, Gurundji Elders, scientists and a linguist. It is written in traditional Gurindji, Gurindgi Kriol and English with a glossary and pronunciation guide. A great read!

In the First Knowledges for Younger People series, 'Songlines' (2023) is written by Margo Neale and Lynne Kelly and illustrated by Blak Douglas. This is most definitely a book for adults as well as children. It is an introduction to Indigenous traditional knowledges including history, art, song and science. It tells us how Songlines work and "how they can help all people thrive into the future."

Come into the Sophia Library to browse or borrow these books and check out other new books on display!
