Fundraiser for Palestine

On August 11th, the Sophia Singers held their first ever Benefit Concert for Palestinian couple Ola Taleb and Ali Abusafia, to raise money for their families suffering in Gaza from the war. The afternoon concert (for many of us) went beyond our wildest expectations, to be an outstanding success, with over 120 people attending, and over \$5000 raised. Held at beautiful Sophia, the Sophia Singers performed eight songs on the themes of peace, love and hope, accompanied by guest flautist Rachel Fisher on two songs.

Ola and Ali spoke about their journey from Gaza to Adelaide, and their family's heartbreaking situation as they struggle to find safety, food and medical supplies. Poet Dinali Devasagayam read from her book *Meanderings on the Margins* (2022), about identity, belonging and refugees, and director, playwright, and actor Rosalba Clemente performed a short story about *"Mrs Church"* a neighbour from her Italian-Australian childhood.

Art work by Gazan children was on display, and the whole event finished up with a tasty spread of Middle Eastern and European food. A big thank you to all who donated, performed, attended, helped with set up and clean up, and anything else to make this event so special. Money donated has already been received by the family to pay for medical supplies, food and clothing.

Helen Oxenham OAM

Helen Oxenham, a passionate pioneer for women's safety from Domestic & Family Violence , passed away recently on July 22nd . Helen was in her 94th year.

I first met Helen when she visited SOPHIA many years ago , with information about "*The Spirit of Woman*"- an organisation, founded by Helen ,with the support of her daughter Heather and a small number of friends , in recent years.

Helen established the 1st Women's Shelter in Christies Beach in the early 1970's, providing a room at the back of her husband's Watch Repairs Shop. Since then, Helen had been successful in fostering a memorial: "The Place of Courage" in many Council areas, like Christies Beach, Cheltenham, Murray Bridge and others - as well as in the Dominican Peace Gardens - (sadly, our "Grieving Woman" sculpture was stolen from the Peace Gardens last year).

More and more of these "ripple sites", with beautiful sculptures to help focus the thoughts of visitors, who come to sit quietly, remembering and grieving the many lost lives of women and children to the scourge of Family and Domestic Violence.

Before the end of the year, we will again place a replica of the stolen *"Grieving Woman"* sculpture -(this time in the Sophia Spiral Garden , where it will be more protected and in sight of a newly installed security camera).

Helen and I became good friends, both living in Hill Avenue - making it easy for me to call in on Helen and chat with her about her inspiring work for the safety of women and children .

The Celebration of Helen's life was a beautiful and memorable occasion - I was very privileged to conduct Helen's Funeral Committal, blessing her with these final words, on a life beautifully lived, with a passion for the safety and wellbeing of women and children:

"Loving and tender God, as You did not lose Helen in giving, so we do not lose Helen by her return. Life is eternal and love is immortal. Death is only an horizon and an horizon is nothing, save the limit of our sight. Prepare us also for that happy place, so that where You are, and where Helen is, we may be also, for evermore ."

On Helen's Memorial Card were these beautiful words:

"She made broken look beautiful and strong look invincible. She walked with the Universe on her shoulders and made it look like a pair of wings " (Ariana Dancu.)

Afternoon Tea in the Library with Dr Kiera Lindsey

Saturday afternoon, 17th August, was no ordinary afternoon. It was time for the sixth annual Afternoon Tea in the Library! We gathered at Sophia to hear Dr Kiera Lindsey, historian, writer and passionate speaker, tell us about the process of writing speculative history in the form of fiction, and in particular, in her third and latest book, '*Wild Love*', the ambitions of Adelaide Ironside, Australia's first artist to astonish the world. In this novel, with its meticulously researched foundation, Adelaide Ironside's life and work are brought to life by many historical characters and events in Sydney in the 1830s-1850s and Rome and London in the 1860s. Adelaide was a feminist and dedicated her short life to her art, with the support and companionship of her mother.

We are grateful to Kiera Lindsey for coming to Sophia and introducing us to Adelaide Ironside in such an engaging way. We also, as usual, enjoyed the generous afternoon tea and the opportunity to share our current favourite books.

Most important in writing a haiku or short poem is: 'mind open, deep attention'.

We enjoyed having time to write and share some haiku and were inspired by haiku in the (discontinued) Australian magazine, '*Paper Wasp*'. Here are three haiku written by Nel, simply while sitting in the conference room, at the workshop:

- Leafless branches Branches full of leaves Colonialism
- Piano music Indigenous baskets Mingling of traditions
- So many chairs Endless possibilities Waiting
